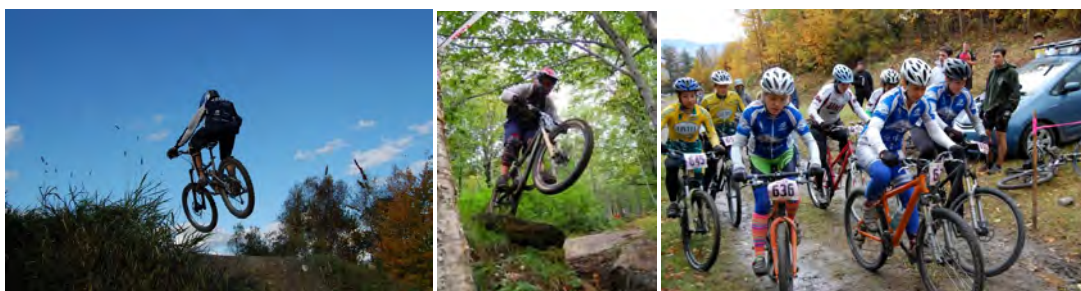

All riders racing ANY event at Highland (STXC, DH, or DS) must fill out a separate waiver for Highland at registration. Lift ticket purchase is only mandatory for DH racers.

Please pre-register using BikeReg.com. Pre-registration accepted until 11pm Thursday, September 16. There will be a \$5 late fee per event for day-of registration.

USA Cycling Collegiate Licenses are required. Annual and one-day licenses will be available at registration (cash and check only).

Saturday registration will be open from 7:00-9:00am at Kingman Farm. Registration will be set up in the lodge at Highland from 3:00-3:30pm on Saturday for anyone that did not check in at the XC venue that morning. Sunday registration will be open from 7:00-9:00am at Highland.

WEEKEND SUMMARY AND COURSE DESCRIPTIONS



The Deal: This year we will be returning to Kingman Farm for our cross-country race on Saturday the 18th of September. Although the venue is the same, the course itself will be modified. Following the conclusion of the XC race, there will be a transition period for lunch and travel as the conference makes its way one hour north to race the infamous Dual Slalom Course at Highland Mountain Bike Park in Northfield, NH!

As for Sunday, all events will take place at Highland.

The Courses: The Kingman Cross Country Classic will be similar to the course of year's past, with some key additions to slow down even the fastest riders. The fast course features a five-mile loop of fire roads, single track, open field and a single-track climb that only the most skilled riders will be able to ascend, and some gnarly switchbacks.

The Dual Slalom course will be the same challenging and technical slalom course created last year by the hard working crew at Highland Mountain Bike Park. The XC riders are always encouraged to give it a shot!

Thanks to the creativity and craftsmanship of James Patterson (aka "Slim" of UVM) we will be putting on a sweet new STXC course.

This year we will also be running a new DH course that Highland built this summer. It's a great course for all levels of riders, with challenging lines for the experts and plenty of slower options for beginning downhillers.

Highland Mountain reserves the right to change run selection if weather becomes a factor.

The Prizes: Prizes will be awarded to the top three riders in each field, in each race. Awards for **all** races will take place approximately half an hour after DH completion on Sunday.

Safety: At Kingman Farm, we will have course marshals on course with radios connected back to the onsite medical staff and the UNH Team. The race is located only about 5 miles away from Wentworth-Douglass Hospital, who has been alerted to our race plans. The most technical portion of the xc race falls in an area right behind the town hall in Madbury and has easy access to the road. The technical section is about 200 yards from the road, so if an ambulance needed to get there quickly, it would be possible.

Highland mountain has its own bike patrol and medics that will be on site and cover the entire event. They have their own medical stations and medics that will be available for all the collegiate races. They have the equipment and the means to provide excellent care to anyone on site.

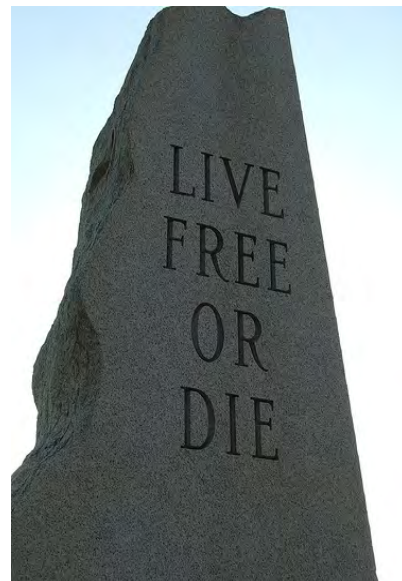
